JANUARY

Burke, James Lee. *Robicheaux*. Struggling with PTSD, alcoholism and wrenching loss, Dave Robicheaux discovers that he may have committed a homicide that he is investigating and endeavors to clear his name and make sense of the killing.

Gardiner, Meg. *Into the Black Nowhere*. Rookie FBI agent Caitlin Hendrix is forced to navigate the twisted mind of a charismatic serial killer responsible for the murders of a series of women in Texas, in a thriller inspired by the case of Ted Bundy.

Harris, Robert. *Munich*. A new spy thriller about treason and conscience, loyalty and betrayal, set against the backdrop of the fateful Munich Conference of September 1938. Robert Harris gives us actual events of historical importance – here are Hitler, Chamberlain, and Mussolini.

Moyes, Jojo. *Still Me*. Louisa Clark arrives in New York ready to start a new life, confident that she can embrace this new adventure *and* keep her relationship with Ambulance Sam alive across several thousand miles.

Robb, J.D. *Dark in Death*. Lieutenant Eve Dallas returns and takes on a case of death imitating art. She receives a tip from an unexpected source: an author of police thrillers who recognizes the crime from the pages of her own book.

Steel, Danielle. *Fall From Grace*. When her wealthy husband dies suddenly in an accident, Sydney is devastated to learn that he left his estate to his vindictive daughters, a situation that forces her to take a job where she is set up to take the fall for a corrupt employer's illegal activities.

Taylor, Brad. *Operator Down*. Former Special Forces Officer Pike Logan's search for a Mossad agent and ally puts him on a collision course with a ruthless military coup in Africa and tests his loyalties to the Taskforce.

FEBRUARY

Berenson, Alex. *The Deceivers*. The Russians don't just want to influence American elections – they want it all. Former CIA agent John Wells confronts a plot of astonishing audacity.

Fielding, Joy. *Bad Daughter*. When her estranged father and his new family are critically injured in a home invasion, Robin returns to mend fences and discover if there is more to this tragedy than meets the eye.

Gardner, Lisa. *Look For Me*. Detective D. D. Warren and *Find Her's* Flora Dane return in a race against the clock to either save a young girl's life...or bring her to justice.

Grippando, James. *Death in Live Oak*. Defense attorney Jack Swyteck takes on the racially fraught case of a white fraternity president accused of murdering his black fraternity brother. Despite the overwhelming evidence against his client, Jack is troubled that his client may be another victim of a very sinister plot.

Hannah, Kristin. *The Great Alone*. Alaska, 1974. Untamed. Unpredictable. And for a family in crisis, the ultimate test of the human spirit. From the author of fan favorite, *The Nightingale*.

- Kellerman, Jonathan. *Night Moves*. Dr. Alex Delaware and his friend LAPD Homicide Detective Milo Sturgis team up once again in a case involving the baffling appearance of a disfigured corpse discovered in an upscale L.A. home.
- Kinsella, Sophie. *Surprise Me*. Sylvie and Dan have a happy, comfortable marriage; they know everything there is to know about each other. When they realize they have decades of sameness ahead of them, they panic!
- Lescroart, John. *Poison*. Dismas Hardy is pulled back into the courtroom when Grant Wagner, the owner of a family business, is murdered. The prime suspect is Wagner's bookkeeper Abby Jarvis who had been receiving large sums of cash under-the-table from the company – but she insists that she's innocent.

- Box, C.J. *The Disappeared*. Wyoming game warden Joe Pickett has two cases to contend with, both lethal.
- Cussler, Clive. *The Rising Sea*. Everywhere, the waters are rising and that is just the beginning of the world's peril, unless the NUMA crew can beat the clock.
- Devereaux, Jude. *As You Wish*. The highly anticipated third installment in the *Summerhouse* series, where three women have the coveted opportunity to answer the age-old question: What would you do differently if you could do it all again?
